California Proposition 28

- Passed overwhelmingly by California voters on November 8, 2022. Will provide nearly \$1 billion dollars annually to fund arts programs in California public schools.
- Prop 28 includes, but is not limited to, instruction and training, supplies, materials, and arts educational partnership programs, for instruction in: dance, media arts, music, theater, and visual arts, including folk art, painting, sculpture, photography, and craft arts, creative expressions, including graphic arts and design, computer coding, animation, music composition and ensembles, and script writing, costume design, film, and video.

California Proposition 28

- Achieve's share of Prop 28 is estimated to be nearly \$50,218 dollars annually. However, the final allocations have not been released by the State and will vary each year
- Prop 28 funds cannot supplant current Arts/Music funding
- Achieve Chico will receive \$32,783 for 2023/24 and \$30,580 for 2024/25
- Achieve Paradise will receive \$17,435 for 2023/24 and \$20,600 for 2024/25
- Additional budget/implementation information is anticipated from the state later this year

Achieve Charter Schools Proposition 28 Implementation Plan

- Provide additional materials/supplies for Arts/Music
- Provide Sound system for Music
- Provide staffing for Arts/Music

Next Steps

- Assessment of current materials and supplies and future needs
- Gathering staff input on music/art professional development
- Complete staffing for 2023/24 and 2024/25
- Identify facilities needs and designate musical spaces at both school sites
- Dream big of ways to further involve and engage students in music and arts education: concerts, before and after school programs, community partnerships!
